



JAN DUSZA SLOVAK REPUBLIC

Ján Dusza is professor of materials science and technology and advanced ceramics at the Institute of materials research, SAS, Košice, Slovak Republic since 1997. He finished at the ELTE University in Budapest, Hungary as a physicist in 1976 and received his PhD and DrSc degree at Technical University of Košice, Slovak Republic in 1983 and 1994, respectively.

Prof. Dusza is working at the IMR SAS since 1976 up to now, as a PhD student, scientist, senior scientist, head of the structural ceramics department and vice director for science. He was an Alexander von Humboldt Fellow at MPI PML in Stuttgart, 1989-1990; Lisa Meitner fellow at the University of Vienna, 1995 –1996; visiting scientist at JRC, IAM, Petten, 1998-1999 and Hertha Filnberg fellow, Austrian Research Center Seibersdorf, 1999 – 2000. Recently he has been appointed member of the Presidium of Slovak Academy of Sciences.

He has over 200 scientific publications and 25 invited lectures, 3 patents and he edited/co-edited more conference proceedings as e.g. Fractography of Advanced Ceramics. Prof. Dusza has received many awards, including the Award of the SAS – For excellent research results, Bratislava; Award of the SAS – For infrastructure building, Bratislava; and Dennis Gabor Award, Budapest. He is an Academician of the World Academy of Ceramics and Hungarian Academy of Sciences and member of the Learn Society of SAS. He is an honorary citizen of the city Tornala in Slovak Republic.

He is a member of the Slovak Silicate Society and regularly attending the ECerS conferences.
